NEW STUDY ROOMS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Three new group study rooms being built in Rentschler Library will be available for booking by the end of October 2024. Two of the new rooms will hold four people each, and a third larger room will hold up to 6 people. Modifications to an existing room (Room 207) will make it unavailable during the project. When completed, the three new rooms, plus our existing two rooms, will provide the campus community with additional meeting space for study groups, student organizations, faculty/staff meetings, and more. The rooms can be scheduled in advance or booked in person without a reservation as they are available.



COURSE RESERVES

Items can be used in-house for 2 hours or even overnight if you prefer. Please fill out our <u>Course Reserve form</u>.



Embedded Librarians are ready to work with you!



Our Embedded Librarian Program involves placing a custom library resources page (with links to databases, tutorials, and other course-specific resources along with contact information for a librarian) in your Canvas course to assist your students at their point of need. All resources included in these guides are selected based on the guidelines for research based assignments in the course. We work with both oncampus and online courses and can provide this service as a supplement to an instruction session. EXPRESS DIGITAL DELIVERY

Rentschler Library is now part of Online Computer Library Center's (OCLC) <u>Express Digital Delivery program</u>. It allows us to quickly fill <u>interlibrary loan requests</u> from a custom group of other libraries in the OCLC consortium. Turnaround time is improved so that means you can acquire articles and book chapters much faster than before. You don't have to do anything. We take care of it for you.






POPULAR READING

Brea McQueen is working with librarians at the national level to launch a new open access scholarly journal, <u>DisLIS</u> (<u>Disabilities in Libraries and Information Studies.</u>) The journal's publishing focus is to center the experience of disability within information work in a variety of library settings. Over the summer, she gave an invited talk at Otterbein University titled Accessible Language for Inclusive Libraries and was an invited panelist at the San Jose State University iSchool Celebration of Disability Pride Month. At the state level, she was appointed co-chair of the Academic Library Association of Ohio (ALAO)'s Diversity Committee.



Krista McDonald just finished a four-year term on the MUL Inclusive Excellence Committee, with the last two years as co-chair, and also recently served on the MU LGBTQ+ Taskforce, and the MiamiTHRIVE Inclusive Excellence Foundational Strengths Committee. She is also one of four approvers for articles submitted for <u>open access (OA) scholarly publishing</u> through OhioLINK.

RCL is a collection development tool used by academic libraries to select the highest quality monographs in support of their campus's academic mission. The ACRL Roundtable Committee will be gearing up to review presentation proposals submitted for the 2025 ACRL Conference in Minneapolis, Minnesota.




