Rentschler Library Celebrates Earth Day



Please help out - your planet needs you!

Rentschler Library is celebrating Earth Day 2012 by practicing the Three R's: REDUCE, REUSE, AND RECYCLE and we challenge **you** to do the same. From **April 16-27**, we invite you to drop off your recyclable materials – including plastic bags, alkaline batteries, crayons, cell phones, cans, plastic bottles, and ink cartridges (from desktop printers). Every time you bring in something to recycle, we will enter your name into a drawing for a very cool tote bag filled with earth friendly goodies.

Celebrating Earth Day..... Every Day!

Rentschler Library is committed to exploring & adopting green practices throughout the year. Below are just a few of the ways we try to Reduce, ReUse & Recycle.

Reduce: Advances in technology have helped us knock our carbon footprint down a little. For example, e-journals and databases make it easy to save & store full-text articles...without wasting toner & paper on photocopies. Similarly, we encourage our users to choose our printers' "scan to email" function over making costly photocopies. We've also been able to reduce photocopying by hundreds of handouts each semester by creating library research guides directly inside Niihka course sites.

ReUse: Each semester, we save hundreds of outdated or undesired books from going to the landfill. Discarded books are donated to Better World Books, where they can be resold for profits that benefit international literacy campaigns & programs.

Recycle: Books that aren't in good enough shape to be donated to Better World Books are recycled locally, thereby saving fuel from transportation AND landfill space. We also encourage users to recycle year-round by offering an alkaline battery recycling receptacle, strategically placed paper recycling bins, and a place to deposit their cans & bottles before entering the library.

OhioLINK Changes

Extended Loan Periods for Faculty

Beginning July 1, the faculty loan period for OhioLINK books will be extended to 6 weeks—doubling the amount of time you can keep them before returning or renewing. The loan period for students and other OhioLINK users will remain 21 days. The number of possible renewals has increased to six (6) times for all users. Users may also place holds on checked-out materials that are ten (10) or fewer days from their due date.

Media loan periods remain just 7 days & will still not be eligible for renewal.

New Delivery Service Provider

Beginning April 13th, *Priority Dispatch* will be OhioLINK's new delivery service provider. Delivery times may be slightly slower during the transition period as drivers grow accustomed to—and make changes to—current delivery routes.


New Library Give-Aways
